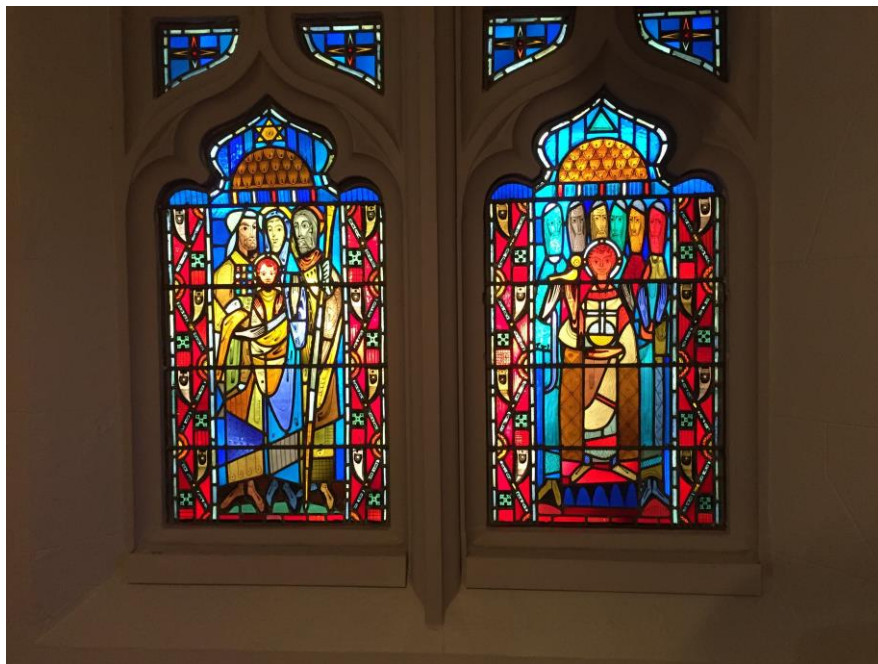

Our Stained Glass Windows

Most of us walk by these two windows twice on Sunday, if we enter the church from the hallway.

The ***Presentation in the Temple*** window is one of two depicting events in the childhood of Christ. The Presentation in the Temple is represented with the Christ Child in the arms of the High Priest. The High Priest is identified by his breastplate adorned with twelve jewels, symbolizing the twelve tribes of Israel. The figures of Mary and Joseph are witnessing the event. The Temple is symbolized by the dome and the Star of David.

In the ***Jesus and the Doctors*** window is portrayed Jesus' coming of age, showing the young Christ in dialogue with the doctors of the Temple at Jerusalem. He is shown in an attitude of awareness of His commission, which is signified by the orb with the cross and the dove of the Holy Spirit.

Take a closer look the next time you enter the church from the hallway!

Trinity Fellowship

All are welcome to attend Trinity Fellowship. The group meets on the first Tuesday of the month, September through May. From 7 until 7:30 p.m., dessert is served.
