“What shall I render unto the Lord for all his benefits toward me?”

—*Psalm 116:12*

November is the season for gratitude. The harvest is in, the rush of the holidays is upon us, and we have just enough time to consider the blessings the Lord God has bestowed on us throughout the year. We must take this time because it isn't always easy in the busyness of life to remember to have gratitude, to “count our blessings,” as the hackneyed saying goes.

We Christians believe all good gifts ultimately come from God, and we reflect our conviction in that reality through our gifts to God and to His Church. Giving the first part of the harvest to God is the age-old recognition that our harvest (or paycheck!) is God's gift. Any farmer will tell you that however hard you might have worked for your living, it could easily have all come to nothing. Every year is, therefore, another gift of God's grace. We must show, to God and to our own hearts, that we know this is true.

Gratitude is more than simply feeling thankful—the Lord never once called for admirers. Gratitude is actually practicing what we believe by giving up our own substance to God. We can do this in many ways—from singing with joy in church to being generous to the poor. Making a pledge to Trinity Church is one of the more important ways. By making a pledge of our time, prayer, and income to Trinity Church, we give to the Body of Jesus a small part of what we have received by God's loving care. It is one part of the mission to Jacksonville the Lord has given to each of us.

The ancient standard for giving is 10% of our incomes, and I encourage all of us to strive for this goal. This is called “tithing.” I pray that all of us could be glad to be able to give so much, but I know that for many of us this is just not possible for the time being. For my own part, I have been able to tithe only a few of my 17 years as a Christian. Yet the Lord, who justified a widow who could only give a tuppence, knows who has given all they can.

I would also like to emphasize that our pledges are not contracts—every year has its own ups and downs, and it's to be expected that our pledges some years turn out to be optimistic. That is fine! It is also fine, by the way, if our pledges turn out to be pessimistic and we find we can give more to God's mission to Jacksonville. Making a pledge of our giving is, however, an invaluable tool for planning that mission for 2018.

So, as your priest, I enjoin all of us to consider how we will respond to God's many blessings in the past year and in the year to come. Please make a pledge to this worshipping community part of that response.
