## **Synod**

The Diocese of Springfield convened its 139<sup>th</sup> Synod in Edwardsville, on October 21, which involved deep discussion about the upcoming changes to our constitution. When these changes are passed, Trinity Church's diocesan designation will change from "parish" to "Eucharistic Community." This change in vocabulary signifies a deep change in how our diocese will operate. "Parish" will take its older meaning as a geographical designation. All souls in our geographical area will be our "mission" as a community. Which means it is time we start thinking about how we, Trinity Church, will make all the people of Jacksonville our mission. Jesus calls us to go out of our doors to proclaim his Gospel to all people—everyone one of us has a part in that task. I look forward to discerning together what form this new mission will take.

## **CROP** Walk for Hunger

Trinity Church had seven walkers participate on the October 16<sup>th</sup> Morgan County CROP Walk at Community Park. The annual walk, sponsored by Church World Service, raised funds to help end hunger on both a community level and an international level.

Twenty-five percent of the funds raised by around 60 walkers will benefit food programs in Morgan County. Walkers wore "walking partner cards," which included information about some of the people who have benefited or will benefit from CROP Walk funds.

Members of the Parish donated \$420.
