"What shall I return to the Lord for all his bounty to me? I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people."—Psalm 116:12,14

There are a few separate items I would like to write about this month. The theme of the 141st Diocese of Springfield Synod, which met near the end of October, was outreach—that holy task the Lord God gave to us in our baptisms of telling the whole world what Jesus has done in our lives. I'd like to share some of the points the bishop touched on. Our diocese's new initiative is to transform how we think about mission. No longer is it enough to open our doors and ensure we are welcoming enough to guests that they decide to stay. Now we have to go out of our doors and meet people where they are. It should be emphasized that this is not in itself a mission to go out and argue people into our pews, though there is little doubt that a missional church is a healthier and perhaps growing church. Neither is it first a call to be mere benefactors to the wider community with contributions to worthy causes, though it will perhaps conclude in that. This mission is to go out as a community and form relationships with the city of Jacksonville, because it is those new friendships that will form the basis for new ministries. It is in our connections with our friends, neighbors, and coworkers where we will find the call of Jesus Christ to the Kingdom of God. Transforming how we think about doing church will take much prayer and reflection, and the most essential part will be in every one of us being able and willing to speak with clarity about God's work in our lives, through word and action. This is God's call to YOU!

On a tangentially related matter, pledge cards have been mailed, and I hope all of us consider making pledges or increasing our pledges for our **2019 Stewardship Campaign.** Giving to the Church of God is one of the ways we express our certainty that God is at work in our lives. It is an expression of our gratitude for God's mercy toward us. Should we not give abundantly because God has given so abundantly to us? It is also, on a more practical note, essential for the good operation of the parish, since it allows the Vestry to plan the budget for the coming year. I understand that money can be tight; pledges can be adjusted down or up depending on what happens in the coming year, and of course every little bit helps. I'd like to set for us the goal of increasing the average pledge of our parish by 20% this year—that is only an extra 75 cents a day for the average pledge and it would drastically shift the budget away from reliance on the endowment. Just an extra 75 cents a day from each family would allow us to expand parish programs into critical activities like outreach. This, again, is God's call to you.

Finally, **November 1** is the **Feast of All Saints**, which we will celebrate here at Trinity Church at **6 pm.** All Saints' Day is a great celebration of the uncountable ways we encounter the salvation of God in our fellow Christians. We can find inspiration and strength in our own mission because we can see in the saints that the Gospel of Christ is true. This year we will be again celebrating with our friends from St. Luke's, Springfield, and Father Shawn Denney will celebrate the Holy Eucharist. It will be followed by a reception in the parish hall. The following day, **November 2**, is the more somber observance of **All Souls' Day**, which we will celebrate in the chapel at **10 am.** This is an opportunity to remember those friends and family that have died. We can remember that they still have space in our lives while entrusting them to the never-failing mercy of the God of Life. Please fill in one of the forms on the table in the lobby to have your loved ones remembered in the Eucharist and consider attending this service.
